The most focused and efficient vehicle in the DonorsTrust portfolio is the field of interest fund, which allows individuals, foundations, or corporations to make contributions to a specific area and transfer the responsibility of disbursing grants to DonorsTrust. Contributors are often invited to recommend projects or organizations and are kept abreast of grantmaking activities. Established field of interest funds include Arts and Culture, Economics, Education, Environment, Foreign Relations, Global Liberty, Health, and Social Welfare.
